Potting and Repotting -NOW is the Time Lee Vanderpool

If you have not begun potting or repotting your deciduous trees, now is the time to do so. Hornbeams, elms, maples, grapes, gingkoes and any other deciduous trees need to be repotted when as nearly dormant as possible. After repotting, remember to keep the plants out of direct sun and out of the wind. Water well the first time then water only when the soil is dry to the touch.

Evergreen hollies such as yaupon can be set aside for the time being as can pines, junipers and other evergreen trees and

shrubs. This is also a good time to repot bald and pond cypress. Remember to keep cypress in a container of water for at least the first few months after repotting although they can remain in water for extended periods.


The key to success when potting or repotting trees is to have a very porous potting mix. The club mix works very well for this area but any well draining mix of organic and inorganic products may be used with good results. Trim trees for shape and remove any branches or twigs which will not be used in the design.

This is the best time to trim deciduous bonsai since you can easily see the branch structure and eliminate the things which are not needed. Do not fertilize until the new buds begin to swell then use a weak mixture of liquid fertilizer. When leaves begin to unfurl later in the spring then you should begin to use solid fertilizers and stronger liquid mixes.
